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JAG Exceeds National Outcomes for the Eleventh Year

New Awards and Partners Allow JAG to Expand Services

Through generous awards and creative partnerships with AT&T, the Workforce Development Division of the Maricopa Community College District, and the Walmart Foundation JAG will increase the number of students served by 20% and provide all our students will additional resources and opportunities. [AT&T's financial support](#), part of their [Aspire Initiative](#) allowed JAG to launch four programs in the Phoenix Union High School District which will serve approximately 200 students. Financial support from the [Walmart Foundation](#), as part of their [Global Women's Economic Empowerment Initiative](#), will allow JAG to implement the Walmart Job Readiness and Job Placement Initiative that will increase the range and intensity of skills and job placement support for over 500 juniors, seniors and graduates this year. Building upon the Walmart Initiative JAG is very excited that [Maricopa Community Colleges Workforce Development](#) office has selected JAG as the first partner to participate in a series of "How It's Made Tours" intended to promote advanced manufacturing careers to high school juniors and seniors. Through this partnership, approximately 100 students will gain first hand exposure to science, technology, engineering and math focused occupations.
